# Cantor Riselle Bain's Message

## December 2021 / 5782

Chanukah, O'Chanukah come light the menorah! Let's have a party we'll all dance the Hora! Finally, after one year and nine months, we will come together to celebrate our Festival of Lights together on December 3<sup>rd</sup>. Temple Israel has opened its doors for in person Shabbat services. We are also continuing to make use of the miracle of technology by making our services available on Facebook Live for those who cannot be with us in person.

As the year is coming to an end, we cannot deny that it has continued to be a difficult time for all. There has been fear, suffering, loneliness, loss of life. The world still suffers from terrorism and violence. Our president, Julie reminds us, "We pray for the world."

As our ancestors before us did so many years ago, we have prevailed. At this time when there is darkness in the world, it is so important for us to bring light into the world – to find light within ourselves and to emanate that light to others.

I thought about the lighting of our chanukiahs (menorahs for Chanukah!). I thought about praying and creating light and hope for a world of peace, health, respect, and harmony. The great teacher Hillel taught us to add light each night. I thought about dedicating the light of each candle for the eight nights of Chanukah to one of our cherished Jewish values.

The first candle to FREEDOM. The Maccabeean revolt against Antiochus Ephiphanes and his forced Hellenization of the Jews (167-160 B.C.E.) was a struggle for freedom – for their very existence – for rights of the minority without threat of repression. Let this candle's light inspire us to protect freedom for all. We also pray for the freedom to hug and be close to each other again.

The second candle to TOLERANCE. Let us continue to strive for a world in which the voice of hatred is no longer taught. Let this candle light the way for us to work for a world of mutual respect and tolerance among all the peoples of the world.

The third candle to PEACE. Let us use our precious freedom to create a world that uses words to build bridges among people and does not employ weapons of destruction -a world in which "they shall beat their swords into plow-shares and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, and they shall not learn war anymore."



The fourth candle to COURAGE – most importantly to have the courage to stand strong with our moral ideals and convictions. Let this light remind us that without that kind of courage, those ideals will remain unfulfilled. Let us always make the courageous choice when it comes to protecting ourselves and others.

The fifth candle to KNOWLEDGE. The quest for Jewish knowledge for ourselves and our children can enrich our lives as Jews, and so enable us to transmit the beauty and depth of our heritage to future generations. Let this light symbolize our commitment to expanding our Jewish knowledge.

The sixth candle to TZEDAKAH – TO JUSTICE – by giving of ourselves and easing the burdens of others. Let this light remind us of other's needs, physical, emotional, spiritual - and inspire us to share what we have and what we are with generosity and love. A phone call to check on a friend at this time is a great mitzvah.

The seventh candle to RESPONSIBILITY – that we understand that each of us has a significant degree of responsibility for the welfare of others. Let the light of this candle remind us that we can proudly bear this responsibility.

The eighth candle is to the CONTINUITY OF THE JEWISH PEOPLE – to be an active participant in Jewish life, so that future generations will learn the joy and beauty of their Jewish heritage from our actions as well as our words. May the light of this candle encourage us to make all the wonderful aspects of Judaism a priority in our lives, intrinsic to our very being. May we never give up on the teachings of our heritage.

In lighting our Chanukah candles, in singing our songs of freedom, in the telling of our people's stories, we will join with Jews all over the world – today – in the past – as well as in the future. May the candles illuminate our minds and warm our hearts and rekindle our commitment to each other and to the Jewish people.


