Cantor Riselle Bain's Message

March 2022 / 5782

In a Jewish leap year, an extra month is added after the Hebrew month of Shevat and before the Hebrew month of Adar. It is called Adar Aleph, Adar Rishon, or Adar I. The month of Adar is then referred to as Adar Bet, Adar Sheni, or Adar II. According to Jewish tradition, Adar is a lucky and happy month. We will enter Adar II together at our Shabbat service on March 4th.

At Temple Israel, are always excited when the month of Adar arrives, because that is when we begin to prepare for our annual Purim Spiel, which will be presented at our Shabbat service on March 18th. At that service we will also hear the cantillation of Megillat Esther, we will eat delicious hamantaschen, and drink Narola's special delicious brew!

The Book of Esther says that Purim comes from the Hebrew work pur, generally translated as "lots," - as in a lottery or in drawing lots.

The holiday is named this because HAMAN, the villain of the Purim Spiel, drew a lottery to determine the date of the destruction of the Jewish people. Instead of HAMAN'S planned genocide, that very day became a triumphant victory for the Jews and was the cause of what we now know as the holiday of Purim. (Megillat Esther 3:7 and 9:26).

The Purim story takes place in the wake of the destruction of the 1st Temple, during a time of national exile. There's a Jewish woman who is basically a political captive and needs to keep her identity hidden. There's a ruthless death sentence decreed upon the entire Jewish people with seemingly no hope to be saved.

But then there's a miraculous turn of events in which every piece of the story plays a role in bringing about national salvation for the Jewish people. It's the transformation of events, the way in which everything gets turned upside down, that is the true miracle that this holiday commemorates.

God's name does not appear at all throughout Megillat Esther, but in the absence of God's explicit presence, the story of Purim reveals God's hidden involvement in our world that never ceases. This is an important message and a promise of hope that this holiday carries, even today in the 21st century in the year 5782.

Besides the fun and merriment and masquerading and drinking, the story of Purim has a serious message for our times. Purim comes to remind Jews and all other peoples that Hamans never completely die away. They keep bobbing up time and time again – to persecute people and pervert freedom. Unfortunately, we see that anti-semitism is currently raising its ugly head again, even right here in the United States.

But from the story of Purim, Jews can take great pride in our people. Though we have had to combat the "Hamans" who would want to destroy us and place the blame of the world's problems on us, we have continued to live proudly as Jews – with self-respect and dignity – to stand up for what is right in life. We are partners with God, our Creator, in Tikkun Olam.

Please join Temple Israel as we present "The Megillah According to Rock n' Roll" on March 18th at 6:30 pm.


