Walking into our Temple Israel sanctuary for our Passover Seder was magical. The magic actually began as I pulled my car into my parking space before entering the temple doors. The view in front of my car was luscious new growth in our garden – roses and beautiful white flowers

Donna Wasson has put in so much love to make our Temple Israel Garden alive with beauty and vibrancy. The following are her words as she describes how she interprets the connection of Shabbat in Sefed, Israel to our garden when it is in full bloom. "I look at it and see three concepts of the Sabbath. As you look at the roses, you will see all the colors as the sun fades on the horizon in the evening. First bud of the rose is a brilliant yellow but then as it fades. Over time the color becomes more and more pale. However, there is no orange or pink in these roses. So, observing the rose we think of the sun. Then look at the young dancers in Safed, twirling in the breeze in their white robes. There are so many little white flowers which represent the joy and innocence of our young people as they welcome the Sabbath bride. Lastly, I look at the Cantor sign with the Star of David. It represents to me the spiritual leadership of Cantors, Rabbis, and Rabbi Luria as they guide their congregations to welcome the Sabbath. Their presence sets apart the Sabbath from all the other days of the week." (Rabbi Luria was born in Jerusalem in 1534 and died in Safed, Israel in 1572. He was the leading rabbi and Jewish mystic in the community of Safed.)

Once inside the temple, the table set up for our Seder looked like a beautiful Jerusalem fairyland. So many of our congregants were helping out – family working together. We are truly a sacred community, embracing the lessons learned in Genesis from Abraham and Sarah's welcoming tent: running to greet guests, under-promising and over-delivering, and ensuring the entire team is committed to building a spiritual haven where every human being is treated as the *b'tzelem Elohim*, the image of God, that they are.

We had a beautiful Passover Seder together – the first time together in three years – thank You, God.

# Cantor Riselle Bain's Message Continued

In May, we will come to the completion of our every other week schedule of celebrating of Shabbat together. June, July, and August we will come together for Shabbat once each month.

There is much for us to include in our two services in May. For our first service on May 6<sup>th</sup>, we will recognize the Holocaust Remembrance (actual date is April 28<sup>th</sup>) and Yom Ha'atzmaut (actual date May 5<sup>th</sup>). On May 20<sup>th</sup>, we will be a little early, but we will celebrate Shavuot (actual date June 5-6). Somehow, we manage to honor the important festivals and holy days at Temple Israel, even though we have to flex a bit to place them as close as possible to our temple schedule!

I look forward to seeing you for these two May services as we continue to create Jewish meaning, purpose, belonging and blessing here at Temple Israel.




