Cantor Riselle Bain's Message

Dear Congregants,

It's Summertime! We enter the Hebrew month of Tammuz on June 30th. Tammuz is the fourth of the 12 months of the Jewish calendar, counting from Nisan.

In Tammuz we begin the "season" of the summer. The three months of the summer season are Tammuz, Av and Elul. Tammuz is considered to be the saddest month of the Jewish calendar. a time of mourning for a Jerusalem destroyed. But with our mourning is the realization that we have survived to mourn, and to do so in a Jerusalem to which we have returned. We can lament. But we can also hope. We can ask ourselves, "Where are the Babylonians? Where are the Romans and the Byzantines? Where are the Ottomans? Torquemada, Hitler, Stalin, Nasser?" – their legacy is dust. We are still here. And not only are Jews a living people: We are a thriving people despite all the internal and external threats to our existence. Jewish survival is not only miraculous. It is a clarion call to the world that Jews are a people and a nation. It is a renaissance that no other people could have accomplished.

In many cultures and societies around the world and far back into antiquity, the word used to describe this most treasured season is derived entirely from a description of its weather. Is that all the summer is about? Heat? In Florida and also in Israel, one could certainly argue that heat is the dominant feature of the summer. Some leave the intense heat here in Florida for the cooler mountains or the breezy seaside. That is one reason why we have only one service per month during the summer months of June, July, and August. In Israel, many hikes and trips are cancelled due to the extreme heat and a government might issue "Ometz Chom" or "Heat Advisory".

And yet, there is a certain magic in the air when summer begins, a certain feeling that can't be found any other time of year. The Jewish People and our sacred texts have referred to this time of year as "kayitz". "Kayitz" is the Hebrew word for summer.

There are two words which we often use interchangeably, but which have very different meanings: "end" and "complete". When something ends, it is often sad, but when something is complete, it is almost always happy. Projects, books whatever you might spend your summer time doing, when you complete these things, you feel a sense of accomplishment, and you grow from the experience.

This is what summer is all about, and specifically what a "Jewish Summer" is all about: putting the finishing touch on all that we've done throughout the rest of the year, and coming one step closer to completion, peace, and fulfillment - all of which, by the way, share the same Hebrew root, "shalom".

Wishing you all a "Jewish Summer" full of Shalom,
