

The emotion-laden chanting of Kol Nidre in its moving, centuries old melody begins Yom Kippur at a feverish pitch. Although Kol Nidre's author is unknown, its text dates back at least to the ninth century and is found in the Seder Rav Amram Gaon of that period. The phrase *Kol Nidrei* comes from Aramaic and means far more than its literal translation, "All Vows." Although Kol Nidre is not part of Maariv, the entire evening service is commonly referred to as that of Kol Nidre night.

Perhaps the most surprising thing of all is why the most solemn day of the year begins with a prayer that is not even a prayer! Kol Nidre makes no mentions of repentance and seems to be no more than an attempt to free oneself from past or future vows. Two explanations are offered, one rational and one kabbalistic.

1) Kol Nidre emphasizes for us the extreme gravity that the Torah attaches not only to formal vows and oaths, but to the general concept that one must keep one's word. And so, when we preface the Yom Kippur prayers not with pleas for forgiveness, but with a declaration regarding vows, we are reminding ourselves of the importance of scrupulously honoring our commitments. We begin Yom Kippur with the recognition that a Jew's word is sacred. We cannot make peace with God until we absolve ourselves from the immoral act of violating our word.

2) Kabbalistically, the message of Kol Nidre is addressed as a plea to God. Since the beginning of its national existence, Israel's transgressions have provoked God to take oaths that God would punish, or even do away with the nation. In the Torah, we find Moses interceding with God on more than one occasion on behalf of Israel's transgressions. We pray that God will hear our prayers not only for ourselves, but also for our dear Israel.

This year we have additional strength and beauty added to our renditions of the Kol Nidre prayer. It is custom to recite Kol Nidre three times: One time the Congregation will read the words from our prayerbook Mishkan Hanefesh, one time I will chant the Kol Nidre, and the added strength and beauty will come from a live offering of Kol Nidre on viola. We will have a special guest with us this year – Donna Ruden's cousin, Trevor New – who will gift us with one of those three renditions of Kol Nidre on the viola. How lucky we are!

To all, I send my wishes for a Shanah Tovah U'metukah -- "a good and sweet year" -- and also for "G'mar Chatimah Tovah -- a good final sealing," in the Book of Life, in which we are inscribed on Rosh Hashanah and sealed on Yom Kippur.
