Dear Congregants,

About 1600 B.C.E., a group of disunited Hebrew tribes left Palestine (because of draught and famine) for Egypt, a rich agricultural land made so by the periodic overflow of the river Nile. Jacob and his family were among those who settled in Egypt. At this time a mixed group of Asiatic nomads, Hyksos, who had taken over the country 100 years before were ruling Egypt, and they welcomed the Hebrews.

Many scholars believe that it was only after the overthrow of the Hyksos rulers by the native Egyptians 1550 B.C.E that the Hebrews were made slaves. "A new king arose over Egypt who did not know Joseph …And the Egyptians set task-masters over them to oppress the Hebrews with forced labor and they built garrison cities for Pharaoh: Pithom and Rameses. (Exodus 1-8, 11)

About 1250 B.C.E. Moses comes on the scene and with his tribe, Levi, and he is foremost in organizing those slaves who were willing to chance the break for freedom.

And so, we have the beginning of our time of redemption by God and our holiday of Passover.

Passover gives us the opportunity to remember our history, to recognize the divisiveness, disregard, and coldness we can still see in modern society, and to work together today to create a place of unity, care and warmth. As we recite the 10 plagues from the Passover story, we also include plagues that we must continue to eradicate in our own modern times.

Expanding our concern and following that concern with actions of mitzvot is a part of what gives a deeper meaning to the Passover holiday. Passover points out what makes the Jewish people unique.



Unlike other nations and races, the Jewish people did not emerge organically from familial offspring. The Jews were originally a gathering of people who became known as "the Jews" when they dedicated themselves to uniting and accepted the responsibility of being "a light unto nations." The Hebrew word for "Jew" [*Yehudi*] comes from the word for "united" [*yihudi*] writes the book *Yaarot Devash*, Part 2. *Yaarot Devash*, is a collection of sermons on ethical matters composed and delivered by R' Jonathan Eybeschutz c.1714 - c.1764 CE.

Through a long process, the people of Israel ultimately stood by Moses, demanded their unity, and triumphed. They united at the foot of Mount Sinai and accepted the law of "love your friend as yourself."

Time is precious and sacred. Passover helps us to relive the miracles of the Exodus story as if we were really there when they happened. We love to tell the story at our Temple Israel seder. We commemorate the Israelites becoming redeemed from Egyptian bondage and finally reaching the Land of Israel after 40 years of wandering in the desert. It is recognized as a New Year because of the formation of the Jewish people after we received the Torah on Mt. Sinai.

As we come together to celebrate our wonderful holiday, may we find unity, peace, redemption, love, and goodness.

Wishing you all a Sissen (sweet) Pesach!


<u>Elections are coming up for 2023 – 2024.</u>


